## Thailand Trip

This report is not a comprehensive story of my trip but only a brief summary. Many people go to Thailand and it is very easy to find information on [www.thaibirding.com](http://www.thaibirding.com). Consequently, I will only share my personal experience which can be useful for others. The main aim was to see the rare Spoonbill Sandpiper. In order to be 100% sure to see it, I hired Nature Track to conduct a two day trip for me. Not sharing costs was expensive but it was worth it.

People told me later that they had to visit this large area many times before locating the 3 birds. We found a Spoon-billed Sandpiper among hundreds of Rufous-necked Stints on the dikes separating the salt ponds. At low tide the waders leave the site to feed on mudflats. The sandpiper moves continuously in one direction without stopping with head down and sweeping from side to side. The other sandpipers move more erratically. Knowing its feeding behaviour is a good way to spot the bird.

In the late morning we went on a boat to find the “White-faced” Plover on a sand spit behind the mangroves. It was located fairly quickly among Malaysian and Kentish Plovers.

Later in the afternoon, I was dropped off at Banka Maka lodge, a very nice homestead about 10 km from the Kaeng Krachan gate. I had beforehand booked Mr Biak through Narida Adithepworaphan [banmaka\\_info@yahoo.com](mailto:banmaka_info@yahoo.com). Banka Maka lodge is run by a Thai birder so it is easy to arrange guiding, food, taxi etc.. We had three days of adventure and saw a lot of good birds such as Ratchet-tailed Treepie and Brown Hornbills. The park was not busy during my stay, but I was told to stay clear in the weekends. A few years back there had been an accident with mammals, so the warden decided to keep the park closed during the dark hours. In addition, disturbing road works made it harder to see mammals in the early morning. This is pity as Kaeng Krachan has all the great mammals in Asia including tiger, leopard, and other cats. The weather was clear but a bit hazy. One morning was cold.

On 21 January, I went to Krabi by AirAsia.com which is the Asian answer to Easy Jet. Everything went on time and the airline was very good deal. Upon arrival I went by taxi directly to Morakot Resort. As soon upon arrival, I contacted Yotin to confirm my booking. I almost lost the trip as 3 Englishmen were about to take my place. He said that it was important to him that clients confirm a booking a few weeks beforehand as he do not want to lose business because of no show up. As I had booked the trip he allowed me to join the English group. An Australian guy who just arrived also wanted to join us, but was refused. It is not possible to join Yotin's trips without pre-booking. This is critical as almost none has seen Gurney's Pitta without Yotin. A two days trip includes visits to two different hides with pittas, general birding in remote parts of the area, visit to two drinking spots, one night spotlighting (extra), and visits to rare stakeouts like in this case Blyth's Hawk-eagle nest. I would say it is waste of time to visit Khao Pra Bang Khram without a pre-booked arrangement with Yotin.

I finished the birding part of my Thailand journey with a boat trip in the mangroves and mudflats near Krabi. It was low tide so the birds were dispersed, but I added a few to my list.

From Puket I went on the Siren boat owned by World Wide Dive & Sail. Although it was a diving trip I managed to find Nicobar Pigeon on Similan Islands together with Pied Pigeon, Christmas Island Frigatebird, Perigrine Falcon & White-bellied Sea-eagles. On my way back to Bangkok I had 8 hours spare time to spend in Bangkok. Consequently, I selected to do a taxi trip to Rachaburi to see the bat colony which was spectacular. During one hour at dusk an estimated 100 million bats leave the cave like smoke from a chimney. Forteen species live in the caves, but only a few can be seen in a small cave behind the temple as the main cave is closed off to the public.

## A dive at Richelieu Rock with Siren

Steve our dive leader on the Siren boat told us that a Whale Shark had been swimming around the dive site. Of course it would have been fantastic to see that fish. However, as diving progressed we soon forgot all about the shark, because the diving here was awesome

I have never seen so many species of coral, anemones and urchins before. Large specimens of Clark's, Orange and Tomato Anemonefish were hanging around and went for hiding as soon we got too close. Andy, our dive master on this underwater adventure was determined to lead us to a special cave at about 22 meters. Here we found several species of fans near a small depression in the wall which was covered with Gray's Carrot corals (*Eleutherobia grayi*) among some large gorgonian fans, a pen coral plus leafy soft corals of the genus *Dendroophtya*.

Suddenly, Andy pointed out a white form of a 3-5 cm long Ghost Pipefish near a fan tree of the same colour. It is so camouflaged that it took us a while to see it, as it liberated itself from the associated coral to swim around the fan.

On the way up to 12 meters, we found a photographer who was busy taking pictures of a shrimp. As he left, we were able to get closer to the shrimp which turned out to be a Harlequin Shrimp. They moved around a green coral. This was a special treat, a long wished creature on my marine list.

While looking at the detail along this garden, no one should forget to watch the large schools of pelagic fish such as marcel and tuna. In addition, we found 5 species of fusiliers, needlefish, yellow-spotted and Giant Trevally, barracudas, jackfish, snappers and emperors.

During the last 10 minutes of this fantastic dive near those famous rocks, we all looked at the coral walls and rocks covered with soft corals in all kinds of colours.

I was grateful to log a close encounter of a Zebra Moray as it popped its head out from a hard coral. This was the first time I had seen this rare creature, which indicated the quality of this world class dive site.
